FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

In today's Gospel (JOHN 15:1-8), Jesus provided another vivid image of His Relationship with God and His disciples including us. Today, He is the strong vine giving us – the fruit – His support; His Father in Heaven is the vinedresser who through His expert skills allows the vine to flourish and the fruit to grow. This metaphor would have been well-understood by the Jews of the time: the vineyard is Israel and the vinedresser, Yahweh, the Hebrew name of God. Jesus used it during the Last Supper to describe His present and future relationship with His disciples to reassure them that He would be with them forever, thus fortifying them in their task of spreading the Good News after Jesus returned to His Father in Heaven. Like the disciples, we are the fruit of the vine, being nourished and

Every time we pray, partake in the Eucharist, and perform acts of charity in His name to those around us, we develop as Christians. In time, we will come to full fruition when we join Jesus in Heaven.

DAY OF PRAYER FOR SURVIVORS OF SEXUAL ABUSE - 30[™] APRIL

Originally observed in Lent, the Bishops, listening to the voices of victims, moved this Day in England & Wales to the **Tuesday** of the Fifth Week of Easter. This year's focus is on communities who have been affected by allegations /convictions related to abuse – especially, but not exclusively, within the Church. This may be associated with clergy, a teacher in a school, a leader of a Catholic group or other person(s) whose investigation or conviction is likely to affect the wider community. There will be legal and financial implications but, for the community, something that addresses their pastoral and spiritual needs can be helpful. It can also support those who need to impart painful information by helping them to draw on spiritual resources beyond themselves. This is not "spiritualising" the situation as if to diminish it; rather, it is to say that, for us, the bar is set higher as we know that all involved are God's children and part of the Body of Christ. DAY OF PRAYER FOR GOD'S BLESSING ON HUMAN WORK – 1ST MAY

In the litany of Saints' Feast Days, **the 1st of May is that of SAINT JOSEPH THE WORKER**. St Joseph is the perfect exemplar of those who labour for themselves and their families. This celebration was promulgated by Pope Pius XII in 1955 to both encourage devotion to St Joseph, the early father of Jesus, and to celebrate the role of workers in humanity. It also acted as a counterpoint to the May-Day celebrations supported by Communist parties globally.
